Open water swimming is one of the fastest-growing aquatic sports, combining high technical skill with the unique challenge and beauty of natural environments. 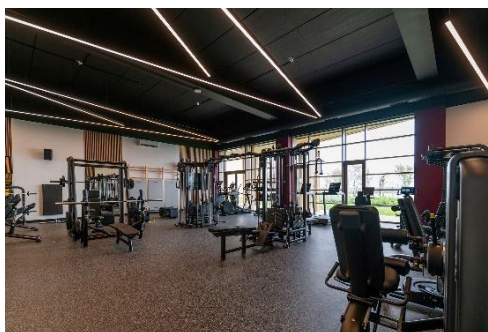

THE VENUE

The town of Sukoro lies on the shores of Hungary's second-largest lake, Lake Velence. It is located appr. 50 km from the nation's capital, Budapest.

The event will be held using the facilities of the National Kayak Academy, a state-of-the-art sports complex dedicated to the development of elite athletes. Officially opened in October 2024, the academy serves as a training hub for hundreds of athletes representing numerous sports. Its architecturally distinctive, multisport environment and world-class water sports infrastructure make it a unique center for high-performance sport in Hungary and internationally. TRAINING SCHEDULE

The official period of stay for team delegations will be from 19 – 27 July 2026. Pool training will take place at the indoor swimming pool of the National Kayak Academy, which is right next to the competition venue, and the LOC provides open water training opportunities on the lake as well. To help with the work of the LOC, you are kindly requested to fill out the attached Pool Training Request Form (broken down by days and sessions) and send it back to the LOC **by 1 July** the latest.

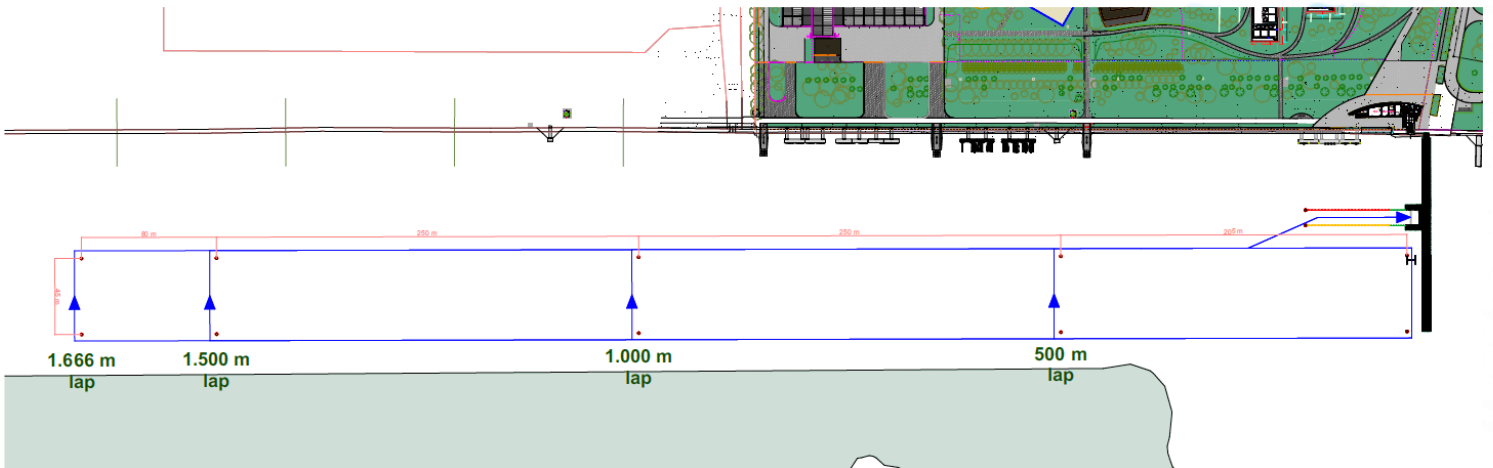

COURSE INFORMATION

The Competition will be organized on the rowing course of the lake, with basically no currents nor waves to be expected. The rectangular shaped course will be marked with 4 main buoys, and each lap will have: 5k – 1.66m (3 laps); 7.5k - 1.5k (5 laps); 10k – 1.66k (6 laps); 6k Mixed Relay - 1.5k each lap; 3k Knockout – 1.5k + 1k + 0.5k.



LOGISTICS, ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

The Hungarian Swimming Federation will organize accommodation to all participating athletes and team officials of that event. Both Official Event hotels lie on the shores of Lake Velence, close to the town of Sukoro. The LOC will provide free transportation for the participants from and to Budapest Liszt Ferenc International Airport, as well as a shuttle service on training and competition days running between the official hotels and the venue provided the LOC receives exact travel information before the **deadline of 1 July**.



For competition days, based on the experience from previous editions, the LOC provides the option for team members to have lunch at the venue instead of the hotel. This means you may opt to have only half board on the chosen days in the hotel and eat lunch at the Academy's facilities (the competition venue). However, this must be indicated on the attached preliminary accommodation booking form, broken down by days and number of persons. Please note that there should be no duplications (i.e. lunch at *both* the hotel and the venue); you must choose in advance if some team members would prefer to have their lunch on site. The LOC can only guarantee this option if the information is submitted before the preliminary accommodation booking **deadline of 23 March!**

PRELIMINARY ENTRY

Preliminary entries shall be submitted together with the preliminary accommodation booking and the on-site lunch requests through the attached form. Deadline to send it back to the LOC (laszlo.szogi@musz.hu) and openwater@europeanaquatics.org is 23 March.



FINAL ENTRIES & ACCREDITATIONS

European Aquatics will send to the respective Federations the link to enter European Aquatics EMS System for Final Sport Entries and Accreditations (link to be provided at a later stage). Feel free to contact openwater@europeanaquatics.org for any additional question. Deadline to submit this information is 13 July.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

All visitors to Hungary should have a valid visa for their entry and stay in the country. The Hungarian Swimming Federation will do its utmost to facilitate an entry visa to Hungary for all participants. In case you need a visa, please contact the LOC at david.szanto@musz.hu **at least 3 months** before the start of the event (of course, no full list of team members needed at this point, however you have to indicate your intention so that the authorities can prepare in time).
